Mission Weekend Nov. 18 & 19. Our mission speaker will be Rev. John Suguitan. He is an SMP pastor (Specific Ministry Pastor program -Concordia St. Louis), with the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS). He has a specific focus on Inner-City ministries. He has been serving Prince of Peace Lutheran Church for over 20 years. Prince of Peace is an inner-city church in the Over-the-Rhine neighborhood in Cincinnati. This church has stood for over 150 years and continues to shine the light of Jesus; Salvation for all God's children. Prince of Peace Lutheran Church has been, and continues to be a diverse church in the Over-the-Rhine / Cincinnati community. Prince of Peace has a long history of serving those struggling within the cycle of poverty, those experiencing homelessness, those with addictions, lack of education, and to all people whatever their struggles, regardless of race and economic status. The church first opened its doors on Race Street in 1871 and continues to serve everyone in the community. It is an outward focused church, meaning that we not only welcome all people inside our doors, but we intentionally reach out and serve the community, with many Prince of Peace & Mercy Ministries. Over-the-Rhine has changed a great deal in the 150+ years we have been in existence, but we remain steadfast and follow as disciples of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, and serve all of God's people, regardless of race or economic status. Pastor Suguitan will give a presentation on the mission work being done after our 9 a.m. service on Sunday. There also will be a for a freewill offering to support mission work of Prince of Peace.
