HOW DO I PAY MY TUITION?

Monthly statements are emailed on the 1st of each month. Payments may be made at MyProcure.com. Payments may also be made by check, cash or credit card and directed to the school office. If you HAVE NOT received your emailed tuition statement, (September 2) we do not have your correct email address on file.

HOT LUNCH PROGRAM

We participate in the National Hot Lunch Program. Lunch costs are \$3.10 per meal and include 1 milk. Additional milk is 35 cents and will be deducted from your lunch account. Deposits to your lunch/milk account can be made by cash, check or card at the office. Online payments are not accepted at this time.

FREE & REDUCED LUNCH APPLICATIONS

Free & Reduced Lunch Applications were mailed to all families in early August. If you have not yet filled out an application, it is not too late. If you are in need of application, they can be picked up at the school office or found online at stpetersreedsburg.com

EMERGENCY CONTACT FORM

If you **HAVE NOT** returned this form to the school office, please do as soon as possible. There is information on the front and back of this form that needs to be completed. This forms changes from year to year and an updated copy is extremely important for the office to have asap. Thank you.

FAST DIRECT

Fast Direct is the school's SIS – School Information System. This program will give you access to your child's grades and hot lunch account. You may also communicate with your teacher through this program. All new families K – 8, will find this information coming home with your child that will include your sign on information.

DO WE KNOW WHERE YOUR CHILD IS GOING?

Teachers will ask students each morning how they are returning home at the end of the school day. Please be sure your child knows this information. Please contact the school office or your child's teacher if this information should change.

FAMILY CAR LINE SIGN

All families are provided with either a blue or yellow Car Line name card. Please place it so it is visible to the teachers as you approach the pick-up area. Please do not block the parking lot entrance and exit.

PLAYGROUND RULES

The playground area is closed until 8:00 a.m. each school day. The playground is also closed from 3:10 p.m. - 3:45 p.m. Children cannot be on the playground during these times even if a parent is present.

WHEN SHOULD MY CHILD STAY HOME SICK?

There will be colds, flu, COVID and other sickness during the school year. These outbreaks affect both students and staff. It is expected that parents/guardians will keep sick children home and take the necessary precautions to prevent the spread of sickness to others. The CDC and Sauk County Health Department Websites have information on sickness and their recommended course of actions. Be reminded that your child should be fever free for 24 hours before returning to school.
