

# Dress Code Reminder

### **Dress Code Reminder**

The weather has gotten warmer and students are starting to wear shorts/dresses. Realize that your child has probably grown. This means that shorts/dresses that were appropriate at the start of the year may not be now.

From the Parent/Student Handbook

A Christian's dress is to reflect an attitude of "a gentle and quiet spirit." (I Peter 3:4) St. Peter's students will dress and groom themselves with taste and modesty, wearing clothing that is neat, clean, and appropriate for their age and the classroom setting. Attire should properly cover the student's front and back, with appropriate length to ensure modesty. Dirty, tattered, suggestive, sexual, overly tight, revealing, vulgar, and alcohol or tobacco related clothing will not be allowed...

Please do not place our teachers in the position of being dress code police or your child in the awkward position of having their dress questioned. You can do this by checking what our child is wearing before leaving for school. Below are some guides to know for certain your child's clothing is appropriate.

- Shorts that are a fingertip length or longer
- Rips in the shorts or pants that are below the fingertips
- Shorts that do not need to be adjusted to be comfortable
- If you are not sure if something is appropriate don't wear it

In the past we attempted to provide an extensive list of does and don'ts for the dress code. It was difficult to keep up with fashion trends. The current policy relies on parents to make sure their children are dressed appropriately for St. Peter's Lutheran School. This is NOT a judgment on what you're allowing your children to wear. I am referring to dress at St. Peter's Lutheran School. Clothing that would not be appropriate for St. Peter's could be totally acceptable for other locations or events.
